- 2. <u>Case Initiating</u> Out-of-State Registration Filings
- 3. <u>Case Initiating</u> Domestic Violence Filings
- 4. Surrogacy Filings
- 5. Writs/Abstracts
- 6. Special Immigrant Juvenile Findings that include a FL-935 Application and Order for Appointment of Guardian Ad Litem (GAL)
